## **GLOBAL STUDY PROGRAM** AT A GLANCE

#### **PROGRAM OVERVIEW**

The purpose of the Global Study Program is to enable top students to enroll in UC Davis courses for credit—which will be applied toward their degree at their home institution—while also furthering students' cultural enrichment and personal growth. The program simultaneously supports the international endeavors of faculty by promoting partnerships with universities around the world.

The tremendous popularity of the program, with 99 percent of students recommending it to their peers, helps to maintain positive relationships with global university partners. The Global Study Program adds geographical and cultural diversity to the undergraduate population of the university, and also provides a robust pathway for attracting talented Ph.D. and master's degree students.

#### **ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS**



Students in the Global Study Program have performed exceptionally well at UC Davis. From 2009 to 2022, over 4,000 students participated in the Global Study Program. On average, those students achieved a 3.15 GPA. Over that time, over a quarter of the population—1,021 students—earned a GPA above 3.7. Of those, 407 were perfect 4.0 GPAs. Their strong academic achievements are especially impressive given that these students are non-native English speakers who disproportionately enroll in upper-division courses in the sciences and engineering. Students in the program also made substantive contributions to undergraduate research, with over 600 completing research internships under the guidance of UC Davis faculty since 2009.



## **GLOBAL STUDY PROGRAM** HIGHLIGHTS

#### **DIVERSITY, EQUITY AND INCLUSION**

Over the past decade, the Global Study Program has expanded its partnerships with a view towards contributing to the diversity of the student body. Beginning in 2012, the Global Study Program adapted to the needs of a specialized scholarship program, Science Without Borders. This program brought over 400 students with low-income backgrounds from Brazil to study at UC Davis. The Global Study Program remains exceptionally proud to have hosted female students from the Science Without Borders program who went on to academic or professional careers in fields with historically low female representation in Brazil, including mechanical and aerospace engineering.

The Global Study Program also participated in the USAID Lotus Scholarship Program, which allowed for six talented and deserving Egyptian students to pursue short-term studies at UC Davis between 2016 and 2019. These students demonstrated a high financial need and were committed to fields vital for ongoing development in Egypt.

Finally, since 2021, the Global Study Program has hosted over 50 students studying at UC Davis through the Indonesian International Student Mobility Awards (IISMA). IISMA is an initiative of the Indonesian government with the stated goal of providing Indonesian students the opportunity to "engage with people from different academic backgrounds, cultures and races, and become global citizens." UC Davis and the Global Study Program were selected from a large pool of American programs for the initial trial, and after just two years, are considered the top choice in the U.S. for students nominated to IISMA.

#### INNOVATIVE TEACHING

The Global Study Program has leveraged its position as a bridge between partner universities and campus departments to spur teaching innovations that have benefited the entire campus community. The work and relationship-building involved in placing visiting students in campus courses has led to tailored versions of existing courses as well as the creation of new ones. GSP funded a course that brought together visiting students from Renmin University with UC Davis undergraduate East Asian Studies (EAS) majors. Course topics included the role of marriage and family in Chinese society, the Chinese economic system, and the role of the press in both China and the United States. By collaborating with EAS on this course, GSP created a space for students to exchange ideas and forge academic relationships across borders.

#### BRINGING FACULTY IDEAS TO LIFE

GSP provides resources and guidance for participating students to connect with UC Davis faculty. This may be in the context of a class, a research project or direct conversation. Students that make these connections frequently cite them as an important benefit of the program.

The Global Study Program has also formed relationships with faculty that have consistently taught and interacted with our students over the years. We are especially proud when these relationships turn into collaborations that help faculty pursue new research or pedagogical ideas. One example is the Chemical Engineering Summer Academy. This program helped faculty in the Chemical Engineering Department to accommodate more domestic students while providing a valuable, high-academic-level experience to visiting GSP students. A partner university approached UC Davis to host their chemical engineering students and, by skillfully arranging sections, we were able to utilize these extra enrollments alongside students on the waiting list to ensure every student interested in that set of courses received a seat.

Faculty in a number of departments have partnered with the program to create unique courses tailored to the needs of visiting international students. Successful courses have been offered in American Studies, Design, Drama, History and the University Writing Program. The drama course is a frequent favorite of GSP students, dozens of whom have gained confidence and presentation skills in spoken English in the dynamic setting of Instructor Michele Apriña Leavy's theater



classroom. Relationships like these have allowed GSP students to make the most of their time at UC Davis, while also benefiting campus faculty as they expand their teaching horizons.



As one of the many who have benefited greatly from GSP, I hope my experience inspires other international students and I will always be an advocate for this program."

#### REGISTRATION MANAGEMENT

Managed by the International Programs team at UC Davis Continuing and Professional Education, the Global Study Program provides students with intensive, wraparound support. The GSP staff operate as a "one-stop-shop," bringing together campus resources and high-quality professionalism to provide help with:

- · Academic oversight and advising (in consultation with departmental advisers)
- Orientation and pre-arrival support
- Cultural adaptation and English language support as needed
- Course registration through BANNER
- Immigration paperwork and housing assistance
- Health insurance advising and emergency assistance
- Cultural excursions
- · Integration into the campus community

Course registration for GSP students is jointly provided by Continuing and Professional Education's Registrar, the Office of the University Registrar and the Global Study Program. Careful oversight ensures that students in the Global Study Program do not displace degree-seeking students. Responsible course management allows the university to benefit from the program, while also protecting course priority for matriculating students.
