- Working with school districts and community organizations in California and across the country to facilitate conversations about race, class, gender and privilege
- Engaging more than 2,000 undergraduates annually through programs, course offerings, distinguished speakers and other events focused on educational equity
- Collaborating with UC Davis School of Law, UCSF and UCLA to conduct a statewide study of school climate, culture, discipline and safety—the largest study of its kind in California
- Scaling up its work—with funding from the Spencer Foundation—to create a nationwide network of university scholars in the area of transformative justice teacher education
- Convening scholars from across the U.S. and from as far away as New Zealand and South Africa in speaker series and symposia focused on confronting educational inequities
