Near and far, we provide culturally inclusive care and increase access to wellness services, leading to greater health equity and outcomes for our communities. Sharing our expertise globally, we champion excellent health care for all.

Meeting Patients Where They Are

Lack of insurance or transportation, inability to pay, scarcity of clinics or providers in local geographic areas and language barriers often keep patients from receiving care. Staffed by School of Nursing faculty and students, the mobile clinic addresses common challenges that patients face when seeking health care in traditional settings. The integrative mobile clinic provides high-quality, evidence-based health care to those experiencing housing insecurity, refugees and unaccompanied minors who live in urban, underserved and rural communities.

Additional support for this project would allow us to add more strategic locations to the mobile clinic and

offer more experiential learning opportunities for School of Nursing students. Gifts would strengthen our ability to meet people where they are, while removing as many barriers to care as possible.

Philanthropy will play a key role in advancing local, regional and global initiatives at the Betty Irene Moore School of Nursing, giving our students opportunities to practice culturally inclusive medicine in our service area and beyond.

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Connecting Students to the Region

Beyond the classroom, beyond Sacramento — since 2017, our nursing and medical students have experienced an immersive mobile education by traveling down California State Route 99 via bus to gain better insight into the people they will care for in the future. Narrated in real time by a Central Valley historian, this classroom on wheels teaches riders cultural humility, the social determinants of health and inequities that impact population health.

We hope to grow this program and offer learning opportunities like this to every UC Davis Health student, post-doctoral trainee, faculty member, administrator and staff member. We also aim to develop a similar trip through the region north of Sacramento. Philanthropy will play a key role in engaging our communities.

Global Engagement

Leveraging years of connections in Africa and expertise in team-based health care education, the Betty Irene Moore School of Nursing developed a collaboration with the University of Nairobi School of Nursing to promote health and wellness via interprofessional education and practice.

Our faculty and alumni led primary care medical camps for groups of HIV-positive women and their children, promoted a team-based community care model and participated in seminars that enhanced their understanding of the United Nations' goals for health and wellness improvement.

Philanthropic support would allow us to establish more clinical sites in Kenya and other international locations, providing our students with global experiential learning opportunities that expand culturally appropriate care.
