Leading the Response to COVID-19

In February 2020, UC Davis Health treated the country's first reported case of community-transmitted COVID-19, leading to early breakthroughs in our knowledge of the novel coronavirus and important changes to testing and treatment. We remain committed to safeguarding public health as the first point of care for many patients.

- UC Davis Health developed and validated our own rapid COVID-19 diagnostic test and now tests all patients in our hospital
- Our health system was one of the first to use a combined COVID-19 and flu test that returns results in 20 minutes, allowing emergency care providers to make fast treatment decisions
- UC Davis Health was one of 120 sites around the world that participated in the Pfizer Inc. COVID-19 vaccine clinical trials
- We were among the first health systems in the nation to vaccinate frontline health care workers
- UC Davis School of Medicine researchers have partnered with drug developers to test potential therapies and vaccines, and conduct more than a dozen clinical trials of potential COVID-19 treatments
