Shining a Pathway Toward Nursing

The Summer Health Institute for Nursing Exploration and Success (SHINES) is an immersive program that encourages diverse high school students (or recently graduated adults) who have an interest in nursing and other health care careers. The purpose of the program is to better prepare participants to make professional and academic decisions about whether nursing is a right fit for them, which nursing pathways would best suit their needs and how to achieve their career goals.

SHINES hosts more than 15 sessions that range from lectures and hands-on workshops to educational experiences in state-of-the-art simulation suites. We also foster professional networks for participants by hosting group mentoring sessions throughout the year, connecting SHINES graduates with experienced School of Nursing alumni.

Philanthropic support for SHINES would allow program leaders to host larger summer cohorts, exposing more students to careers in nursing and helping guide them if they would like to become nurses.

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Accelerating Careers in Nursing

The evolving landscape of health care requires more employers to hire a more skilled workforce with advanced education and significant experience. Programs at the School of Nursing prepare nurses with the knowledge and skills to meet the needs of a constantly changing health care system.

The **Master's Entry Program in Nursing (MEPN)** offers the quickest route toward a registered nursing licensure for adults who would like to transition into this profession. MEPN is led by an interprofessional team of more than 60 faculty from disciplines including health informatics, biostatistics, pharmacy, public health and more. The curriculum prepares students to become leaders in quality and safety, advocates for diverse patient populations, and agents of change for healthier communities.

Inspiring Younger Generations

Aiming to better serve future nurses, the Betty Irene Moore School of Nursing is developing programs and pursuing partnerships with local school districts and community colleges that will reach students earlier in their academic and professional journeys, giving them the confidence and knowledge to explore what a career in nursing has to offer. We are also cultivating a support system of faculty and staff who reflect the diversity that we hope to see among our School of Nursing students.
