From a one-day homebrewing course launched in 1976 to today's internationally recognized **Master Brewers Certificate Program,** UC Davis Continuing and Professional Education programs have been at the forefront of brewing education in the United States and the world.

Great Brewers Are Created Here

Since 2000, more than 800 brewers have earned our Master Brewers credential—many going on to enjoy successful careers in the brewing industry. In 2022 we added an online pathway to certification, opening virtual doors for brewers around the world, with an optional in-person boot camp where participants spend a full week learning at our state-of-the-art facilities.

In addition to our flagship certificate program we offer courses in brewing science, quality and the business of craft beer to benefit brewers at all skill levels.

Our courses give industry professionals access to UC Davis' award-winning instructors, world-class facilities, and signature values of sustainability and diversity. At our groundbreaking LEED Platinumcertified facility, faculty are developing new ways to remain sustainable in a changing world—from experimenting with drought-tolerant barley crops to upcycling waste streams from beermaking into energy sources that can then be used to fuel the brewing process. And with our Tapping Potential scholarships, we've seeded a global network of women and underrepresented brewers.

Lana Svitankova, a Kyiv-based writer dedicated to Ukraine's beer culture, is one of several women awarded the 2023 Tapping Potential diversity scholarship. Fellow recipient Chijundu Onwuchekwa, a quality control supervisor at West Africa's first microbrewery, aims to open the first female-led brewery in Nigeria. And beer sommelier Nadhine França—the first woman president of Brazilian Craft Beer Association Abracerva—is launching a new brewing career in Budapest. For them, our programs offer more than an excellent education—they confer a mark of respect in an industry where women are working to establish themselves as equals.

While many larger companies offer paid internships, most independent breweries don't have the financial capacity to do so. We envision a fund that will support paid internships at smaller breweries—creating a win-win for the industry.
