The Institute of the Environment's Inspiring
Environmental and Climate Activism Through Art
initiative motivates community climate action
through the arts. Through partnerships centered
around art as a medium to amplify awareness of and
solutions for climate change, the initiative supports
student and community outreach and learning
opportunities.

Our inaugural project, the California Climate Art Trail, brings together diverse communities of activists in pursuit of one common goal: to harness the power of art to inspire change. Together, community members are creating a series of murals painted on barns, in community parks and within gardens throughout the state.

The Institue of the Environment is partnering with creative students, youth groups, educators, farmers and energy and agricultural organizations to show how climate change affects agricultural communities and how these communities are responding with resilience.

Art in Action

Leveraging the power of art to reach a large audience, UC Davis launched its California Climate Art Trail project.

"Race to net zero," "Orchards capture carbon" and "What a climate bargain" are some of the phrases found along a Davis county road. What began as an idea from two members of the local agricultural community has resulted in a partnership that has inspired a course focused on climate activism and art, as well as an opportunity to display students' original artwork.

More than 250 people, aged eight to 80, came together for the inaugural community paint day to replicate a UC Davis student's illustration on the side of a prominent barn. They lent their time and talent to illustrating a version of the Sacramento Valley strengthened by climate-resilient crops, alternative energy, transportation, wildlife, flood plains and restored wetlands.

Community events like this will be repeated throughout the agricultural valleys of the state. Murals will be tailored to each community—reflecting their climate change priorities, challenges and solutions.

Together, we can bolster art in the Central Valley and make a profound difference in the fight against climate change.
