

Realizing the Vision



1 ADVANCING RESEARCH AND INNOVATION IN KEY COLLEGE PROGRAMS

Our ingenuity, passion and drive for solutions fuel a flourishing campus culture of innovation, creativity and service to society. The priority initiatives below represent college programs that draw on the expertise and insights of scholars across the disciplines to break new ground in research and creative fields, and create transformative student opportunities.

Arts Renaissance

Respected around the world, the Art Studio program at UC Davis has a long history of outstanding faculty, students and graduates. In collaboration with the Jan Shrem and Maria Manetti Shrem Museum of Art, the college has a unique opportunity to reimagine our arts education programs. With the support of philanthropic partners, our goal is to launch new programs, a new curriculum, reinvigorated student recruitment efforts, a robust visiting artist program, and new facilities to house, nurture and grow our arts education and student programming.



Brain, Data, Digital Personality and Decision Sciences

Leveraging broad-ranging faculty expertise including renowned strengths in the Center for Mind and Brain, psychology and cognitive sciences, and a newly created data studies program, the college is launching a collaborative effort focused on transforming how we gather and use data, expanding our understanding of the mind and brain, and rethinking decision-making in an ever-changing world. Endowments that support research, student fellowships, and the creation of innovation space will realize the full promise of this initiative.



Design Futures

As the only comprehensive design department within the University of California system, and with a strong foundation of interdisciplinary collaboration, the design department is committed to leading a national conversation about the diversity and impact of design.

Drawing on unique assets including a leading-edge cinema and digital technologies department, a hacker lab, and performing and visual arts programs, the department is poised to shape the future of design innovation, given the resources to support faculty research, graduate education and other key priorities.

Chemistry and Physics Innovations

Naming opportunities to enhance our chemistry facilities will play a vital role in elevating the world-class research that takes place within them. Strategic priorities include new classrooms, rooms for consultations, a visualization center equipped with interactive video capabilities, a modern lobby space and a highly visible research lab.

Within our highly ranked physics department, our Center for Quantum Mathematics and Physics (QMAP) is at the forefront of fundamental research. Philanthropic support—including endowed funding to provide postdoctoral fellowships and sponsor a seminar series, conferences and public lectures—will be key to enhancing the department's and QMAP's programs.

C.N. Gorman Museum

For more than 40 years, the C.N. Gorman Museum has reflected the vibrancy of contemporary Native American and Indigenous fine art. Now, the museum is planning to relocate to a new campus home in Nelson Hall, adjacent to the UC Davis Arboretum and Public Garden. This new building will join the Manetti Shrem Museum and the Mondavi Center as a cornerstone of the flourishing Arts District that showcases UC Davis' commitment to excellence in the arts. The new space will also elevate our teaching and research mission, amplify our impact on our diverse audiences and showcase the cutting edge of artistic excellence among sovereign nations, tribes and indigenous communities worldwide.

Philanthropic support will bring this vision to life, establishing the Gorman Museum as a renowned destination for Native American and Indigenous contemporary art, as a catalyst for lifelong learning and creative achievements, and as a inspiration to the next generation of museum leaders.

Global Tea Initiative

Just as UC Davis shaped the international conversation about wine, we are ideally positioned to approach tea in a new and truly comprehensive way. With the support of philanthropic partners who share our vision, we are poised to create the world's first center for the multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary study of tea.

The Global Tea Initiative for the Study of Tea Culture and Science draws on the expertise of scholars and educators across the sciences, humanities and social sciences—fostering collaborations that explore tea's influence on virtually every sphere, from ceramics to gender roles, trade and commerce, and health practices all over the world.

Our vision is to create an international hub where cross-disciplinary research, symposia, lecture series, classes and exhibitions come together under one roof to advance knowledge about this globally significant beverage.




GROWING OUR RANKS OF WORLD-CLASS FACULTY

- Create professional development opportunities that align with liberal arts and sciences education






FOSTERING A CULTURE OF MENTORSHIP: FACULTY OF DISTINCTION INITIATIVE

The college is home to distinguished faculty members across more than 50 disciplinary fields. By investing nearly \$100 million in the last decade in recruitment, seed funding and academic infrastructure renovations, the college has made a powerful commitment to enhancing the culture of academic excellence that supports our faculty.

Over the past decade, the college has hired more than 200 new faculty members—an increase of 30%. To ensure a **robust and supportive environment to foster the success of our newest faculty members,** particularly those at an early stage in their careers, the college has spearheaded the Faculty of Distinction initiative: a comprehensive mentorship program to support their professional development and advance their research efforts with named faculty fellowships.

 Establish a faculty mentoring program with rotating faculty fellowships for our early-career faculty members






AMPLIFYING THE IMPACT OF ACADEMIC DEPARTMENTS

Ways of Giving

We respect that, for each donor who wishes to provide significant philanthropic support, there are personal, financial and gift planning aspects to consider. We are committed to working with you to realize your philanthropic vision and develop the gift plan that best meets your needs. At your request, we can also work with your tax and financial advisors. Following are various gift types and their associated benefits.

You may wish to consider a mix of gift types to help you achieve both your philanthropic and financial objectives.

Cash Gifts

- Are the simplest and most popular giving method
- Can be tax deductible in the year they are given

Gifts of Securities

- Include stocks, mutual funds and bonds
- Can avoid capital gains taxes
- Can provide an income tax deduction for the full fair market value of long-term, appreciated securities

Gifts of Real Property

- Include land, farms, personal residences, and rental or commercial property
- Can avoid capital gains tax on appreciated assets
- Can provide an income tax deduction for the full fair market value of long-term, appreciated property
- Can eliminate property expenses and taxes
- Can provide continued use for life through a retained life estate gift

Bequests and Living Trusts

- Establish the UC Davis Foundation as a beneficiary of your estate
- Can provide an estate tax deduction equal to the value of the gift
- Offer flexibility by allowing you to provide for family first

Retirement Plan Gifts

- For current gifts, utilize the IRA Charitable Rollover provision (for donors aged 70½ and older)
- Name the UC Davis Foundation as a beneficiary
- Can eliminate income tax on the plan distributions
- Preserve the plan's full value for gift purposes

Life Income Gifts

- Include charitable remainder trusts and gift annuities
- Can provide potential tax savings on income, estate and capital gains
- Generate income for you and/or your loved ones for a fixed period of time or until your passing
- Distribute the remaining assets to the UC Davis Foundation
