Environmental Fellows and Scholars program

This program focuses on cutting-edge sustainability and environmental justice activities with the potential to bridge disciplines and Institute initiatives.

 Environmental Fellows: Six fellowships awarded annually to early- and mid-career faculty and professional staff.

Philanthropic Opportunities

- Establish an endowed visiting scholars program to honor remarkable scholars **GOAL: \$2 MILLION**
- Endow the Earth Scholars program to develop hands-on learning opportunities for students GOAL: \$250,000
- Support the teaching and research priorities of exceptional faculty through **Environmental Fellowships \$15,000 PER FELLOW**
- Provide student support for the Sustainability Scholars program and spark new research projects **GIFTS STARTING AT: \$5,000**
- Earth Scholars: 20 graduate student awarded scholarships every year. Each scholar is paired with an Environmental Fellow mentor.
- Sustainability Scholars: 30 undergraduate students are organized annually into sustainability action research teams and work alongside Environmental Fellows and Earth Scholars.

Master's Program in Environmental Policy and Management

Our graduate student program provides advanced training for STEM students interested in pursuing careers in environmental policy and management, and applying environmental and climate-change science to real-world issues. Preparing the next generation of environmental leaders to take a collaborative, community-driven approach to policymaking is at the core of this program. Internship opportunities as Earth Scholars provides networking opportunities with external partners.

Institute of the Environment (IE) Thought Leaders

We convene national and international visiting scholars from various backgrounds-including higher education, governmental and non-governmental organizations, and private industry-to strengthen our intellectual community by sharing ideas and contributing expertise while in-residence.
